

### Upstairs, Downstairs - Artist Workshop and Luminous Layers at the MACC

On July 21st Rancho Cordova Arts hosted its first free Artists' Workshop at the MACC. Built in 1911, the landmark Mills Station Building was recently refurbished as the Mills Station Arts and Culture Center. The MACC is a spacious facility for art and history exhibits, presentations, films, and projects.

Many of the artists gathered on Saturday morning were long-time members of the Rancho Cordova arts community; others were more recent arrivals enjoying an opportunity to meet compatriots and learn about local art opportunities. The workshop started in a relaxed fashion, with people working on current art projects and chatting over coffee, then moved on to presentations on practical topics such as framing and matting artworks, getting the best photographs, and preparing pieces for transportation and display at events such as the annual "Brushes and Brews" on August 25th at Ol' Republic Brewery.

The workshop, held upstairs, was scheduled to coincide with the opening reception of the main floor art exhibit "Luminous Layers," the Sierra Wax Artists' membership show. This exhibit included a demonstration of the encaustic process by artist Linda Nunes. Encaustic is a technique dating back to the first century B.C. in which bees' wax and tree resin are melted together with pigments and applied in layers to a rigid surface. Other objects or media can be added to create a collage-like effect.

The next **Artist Workshop** at the MACC will be Saturday, September 22nd, 10am to 2pm. Bring your art supplies! – Miriam Rainbird

If you're making 3-dimensional pieces, make sure they will fit into the glass case [or be freestanding and touchable by the public, especially children]. Your 2-dimensional pieces should have sturdy framing and be wired as shown on Cordova Community Council's "Call for Artists." 


## HOLIDAY POP-UP ART GALLERY

# ART TIPS

## Question:

How can I make objects advance forward into the foreground of my artwork? What makes things recede into the background?

## Answer:

Artists use a set of tools called 'Atmospheric Perspective' to create the illusion of depth in 2-dimensional work, based on the phenomenon of colors and contrasts shifting as things recede into the distance. You can use value (dark and light), color, contrast, and detail to lead viewers' eyes into and around your images.



### Here's a quick guide to making the position of objects in your art make sense.

Advances to Foreground	Retreats into the Background
Warmer Colors (Red, Yellow, Orange)	Cooler Colors (Green, Blue, Violet) Some painters use a light glaze of cobalt blue over an object to send it 'backwards'.
More Detail	Less Detail
Sharper	Blurry
More Contrast (Value and colors)	Less Contrast
Clearer Colors (No grayness)	Muted Colors (More grayness)
Front position in overlapping objects	Rear position in overlapping objects*
Things are bigger (If you're sketching, use thicker lines)	Things are smaller (If you're sketching, use thinner lines)

\*Conversely, you can use this guide to 'fool the eye' (no overlap!), as shown in this photo.
