# **Members Show**

Exhibit June 3-19, 2021 At the MACC Mills Station Arts & Culture Center 10191 Mills Station Road Rancho Cordova, CA

This year's Members Show has an **open theme**. This is an opportunity to show your best work, engage with viewers, and display your creativity. Each member is guaranteed at least one artwork will be juried into the show. There is **no entry fee** for your art. You may submit up to 3 artworks. All mediums are acceptable except video and installations.

All artists must be **current members of Rancho Cordova Arts** to apply. Not yet a member? You can go to www.RanchoCordovaArts.org and click **JOIN** today for just \$25 a year! Great benefits and a fun artist group!

<u>Size restriction</u>: Nothing bigger than 48" wide and 60" high will be accepted. There is no minimum size restriction. Pieces that hang may not exceed 40 lbs. 3-D work must fit through a standard door.

<u>For Selected Works</u>: Once selected, artists will receive a copy of the Artist Contract via email. The MACC takes 20% and the artist keeps 80% of all art sold. Your art must be wired properly and ready to hang or display. Make sure your name, email, phone and title are on each piece.

- Wednesday, May 19<sup>th</sup> 8am-12 noon
- Thursday, May 20<sup>th</sup> 12noon-5 pm

Pick up of Unselected Works: May 21st 8-5 pm.

There will be no artist reception this year because of Covid protocols.

Pick Up ART after the show: Tuesday, June 22<sup>nd</sup> - 9-5 pm

## Rancho Cordova Utility Box Art Wrap Project

Congratulations to our eight members of Rancho Cordova Arts, for being selected to provide the art to wrap utility boxes in the City of Rancho Cordova's call for artists!

For those who are thinking about submitting art for utility boxes next time, know that this is different than submitting art for a show. When you submit for a City Hall art show, for example, what you submit to be juried in is what hangs on the wall. But for utility boxes, the artist must submit a digital image. Being accepted to provide art for a utility box art wrap doesn't mean you're done making art; it may be a beginning!

Emily Goldhahn described how she painted two canvasboards, each one designed to cover two adjacent sides of a box. When placed side-by-side, they formed a continuous picture. She uploaded her digital images into the standard template and submitted them to the City. Once her artwork was juried in, she was told the location and dimensions of her box.

Now, utility boxes come in all kinds of sizes. Guess what? The box she needed to cover with artwork would have to be more than twice as wide as the art she had made. She solved the problem by cutting her 2 boards where they would wrap around a corner of the box, trimmed off the tops and bottoms, and painted additional art to fill in the extensions to the corners. Now she had a wide enough image to wrap her box.

She set the canvasboards out with sides touching, and took photos of the new arrangement. These jpeg images were 'fixed' in Photoshop Elements to 'join' the canvasboard edges, so the artwork would look like one painting. Emily uploaded the four, full-size images (1 image per side) to the City for printing on the vinyl wrap. The City contracted with a local Rancho Cordova company to print and wrap the utility boxes.

Many thanks go to Daniel Leonardich, a member of the City's Community Enhancement Fund team, for being so helpful to all the artists. The City will announce the art wraps to the public once they are all installed, sometime in the weeks ahead. Expect an update in the next 'On the Easel' newsletter.
