## Rancho Cordova Arts Celebrated as City's "Distinguished Community Service Organization"

Rancho Cordova City Hall was transformed into a galleon, sailing shark-infested waters replete with salty pirates, skeletons of forgotten buccaneers and chests of booty galore! "Treasuring Volunteers" was the theme for Cordova Community Council's 24th Annual Community Volunteer Awards Banquet where 180 community members gathered to celebrate on March 8th, 2024.

Rancho Cordova Arts was honored as the Distinguished Community Service Organization for being a home-grown organization whose passion is to make Rancho Cordova a more vibrant, artful place. We bring fun, free art activities to the public at Kid's Day in the Park and iFest (International Festival), staff the quarterly Art at City Hall exhibits, offer art classes and workshops, and put on special art events like Winter Fest and [the former] Brushes & Brews, among other things. We also support arts education for children in our K-12 schools through our MicroMasterpieces annual fundraiser where artists donate 6"X6" artworks for auction. The proceeds have so far provided over \$35,000 in new art supplies for teachers to use in Rancho Cordova classrooms.


This is the most labor-intensive show of the year, and we couldn't do it without the help of volunteers like Deborah Kelly and Judy Pinner gave last year.

## FROM ONE CREATIVE TO ANOTHER by Jamie S. Perry



If you're reading this right now, you are either an artist, a maker, or someone who appreciates the work produced by those who create. This article is an introduction to why we create, how we create, and what compels us to create.

In short, making things is and has always been a method of communicating with the people in our world, beings who may be outside of it, and with ourselves. We 'speak' the common language of imagery and artifact.

Being someone who delights in being described as creative, artistic, talented, imaginative, original, inventive, gifted, and clever, I wear each adjective as a badge of honor! I delight in having the ability to easily communicate using images and coming up with fresh ideas. And I'm still learning that these qualities have to be polished in order to keep them bright and beautiful...

To do that, I have created a special time to get into my head and check in with my Artist-self. It's commonly called a "Creative Practice". (Practice makes Perfect...) Without my creative practice, I become stagnant and uncommunicative: just the right mental environment for "artist's block" and laziness to creep in.

Creative Practice takes many forms and it may be different for every one of us creative people. The

common aspect is that our practice is (ideally) something that we can do every day that may become the best part of OUR EVERY day. A creative practice keeps me growing in all kinds of directions, sometimes many all at once! There may be discoveries that excite and ignite my itch to make something IMMEDIATELY! It's time for me to put something special into the world that has never been there before! Think about it: On any given day, we creatives have the ability to put things in the world that have never before existed. This is our Super Power.

## "This is our Super Power."

One of the easiest ways to exercise this magic part of the brain is to keep a sketchbook/journal. I take only a little time to scribble a gesture drawing or write down spontaneous thoughts, words, or ideas. I began my practice by setting aside a minimum of five minutes while having morning coffee. No TV, no music, no newspapers, no devices - just me, a sketchbook, a pencil, and my thoughts. I increased my sketchbook time each week, and got to a place where the time varied depending what was going on in my head and what my day looked like. Now I have a sketchbook with me at all times. (Things I think I'll put down later, often float away forgotten...)

Over the years, I produced at least 50 sketchbooks. They stood on the shelf in my studio. Now and then (especially when I wasn't sure what I wanted to work on) I'd choose a sketchbook at random and start thumbing through its pages. A doodle or word could shift my thinking onto new, unexpected trajectories! Invariably something would "talk to me" and would become A-Thing-In-The-World that I had to create!

You may say, "I already know all this." And you probably do. But it never hurts to make a date with your Artist-self, if only to keep a Creative creative.

## Mask Show at City Hall - Deadline April 19

Hard to believe it is almost intake time for our Quarter 2 show – "MASKS!" This show is all about masks. Masks are physical things we don for ritual, holiday, ceremony or just for fun. Masks can also be the many faces or "masks" we wear literally on our face like those created by make-up artists for movies and theater. I collect African masks, and masks from my travels. This show can be about a three-dimensional object, or it can be presented in a two-dimensional way on canvas or panel. At City Hall we do not have space in the hallways for sculpture stands. Make sure that your piece can either fit in the case (maximum 9" deep x 16" tall) or hang safely on the wall.

Intake day (April 26) is also pick up day for the previous exhibit, "Textures." This process means fewer trips to City Hall for the artists and reduces staff hours. Make sure you fill out the online form for the "MASKS" show on the Cordova Community Council website under 'programs – art at city hall'. The online submission form captures your data for the creation of labels for the show. Spelling, punctuation, correct emails and prices are critical.

Our Juror, Dwight Head, is a talented Sacramento artist and has juried before for us. He is a surrealist artist and illustrator. He depicts images from everyday life using personal contemporary imagery. I cannot wait to see what you bring to intake.





## **Upstairs at the MACC**

One of the ways to highlight our Rancho Cordova Arts members is to be a Spotlight Artist in the upstairs gallery at the MACC. The artist must have a body of work enough to fill the space, curate a cohesive body of work, and have a title that represents the body of work. The artist is responsible for hanging the work and labeling the work or providing the gallery with an inventory list to print labels. Any signage such as the artist's statement, biography, CV or explanations of the work must be created by the artist. Then finally the artist has an artist talk where you can hear the premise of the work and the inspirations of the artist. The artist talks are great ways to get to know your fellow members and artists. Learn a bit about how they got to where they are now and what excites them about the work they do. Hearing the thoughts of an artist can really give you an appreciation and understanding about their art. It is stories artists tell which bridge connections to a piece of art or even a body of work. It may also help to interpret others' work when you see similarities.

This year so far we have had three wonderful spotlight Artists – Alexandra Yakovlevas' "Segmented Abstract", Elizabeth Halls' "Out of the Shadows", and Susan Cooper's "Endangered." If you missed these artist talks, there are many more this year to come. When a MACC exhibition takes up both the first and second floor there is no spotlight artist.

May brings a thought-provoking show to the Upstairs Gallery at the MACC. Cherie Hackers' "Linked by Nature" is a project that started in 2003. "Linked by Nature" runs from May 9th through May 25th. Mark your calendars to attend the reception and artist talk on Friday May 17th 5:30-7:30PM.
